RE: Notice of Motion – Proposed Amendments to the PETL Constitution and

Bylaws

As per the PETL Constitution and Bylaws, all proposed amendments to the Constitution (Article 12.3) and Bylaws (Article 12.4), received by the Executive, must be published to the general membership at least 14 days prior to the PETL Annual General Meeting (AGM).

The following proposed amendments to the Peel Elementary Teachers' Local Constitution and Bylaws will be presented and voted on at the PETL AGM on May 28, 2024 and will take effect immediately upon their adoption, unless otherwise specified. These proposed amendments can also be found in the Member Secure Area (MSA) of the local website at www.etfopeel.com.

 - (d) **Eight (8)** Committee Chairs:
 - (1) Chair of the Two Spirit and LGBTQIA+ Committee

- (a) There shall be the following standing committees:
 - (1) Two Spirit and LGBTQIA+

RATIONALE:

At the 2023 ETFO Annual Meeting, delegates passed a motion "that locals shall strive to establish a Two Spirit and LGBTQIA+ standing committee". As the second largest local in the province, the PETL has the ability and the capacity to operationalize this motion. Given the current social and political climate, there is a need to create a Two Spirit and LGBTQIA+ standing committee to provide members with learning opportunities and respond to Two Spirit and LGBTQIA+ issues. This standing committee aligns with the PETL Strategic Plan for equity.

8.1.3 There shall be three General Membership Meetings (GMMs) per year (one in the fall, one in the winter, and one additional during the year). There shall be an Annual General Meeting (AGM) in the spring.

RATIONALE:

Currently, it is not uncommon for local General Membership Meetings (GMMs) to run well past 7:00 p.m. After a long workday, it is difficult to sit through a three hour or longer meeting. We also lose many members who can only stay for a short time due to other responsibilities and personal commitments. By adding one additional GMM we would hopefully be able to spread out the important work we need to do throughout the year and honour members' personal time.

MOTION 5:

That Constitution Article IX – Elections, Section 1 – Eligibility, be amended to read:

9.1.1 An active member, including members on Employment Standards Act (ESA) leaves, may be nominated to stand for elected office.

RATIONALE:

Teachers are considered active members of the local while on ESA leaves. According to the PETL Constitution, an active member may be nominated to stand for elected office. This motion does not change the practice or the spirit of our constitution. It simply clarifies where there may be confusion regarding the eligibility of members on ESA leave during local elections.

9.4.1 If a permanent vacancy or a vacancy of 90 or more days occurs during the term of a Vice-President, a by-election will determine how the vacancy is filled, so long as there are 90 or more days remaining to be served in the term.

RATIONALE:

The Vice-President liaison is the single most important connection members have to the local. A democratic by-election will allow for the membership to decide who the successful Vice-President is via a process that is transparent and centers the choice and voice of members. This would replace the current process of the Executive appointing a Vice-

President on behalf of the membership via a secret ballot vote. Vice-Presidents should be chosen by the membership, not by an Executive that holds all the power. Any PETL member should be able to run for a vacancy and all PETL members should have a say in who the elected Vice-President is.

(a) A member must anticipate being an active member of the Local as of September 1 in order to attend as a PETL delegate.

RATIONALE:

In past years, the PETL delegation to the ETFO Annual Meeting has included members who were already retired or those who had already accepted promotions to the position of Vice-Principal effective September 1. The purpose of the ETFO Annual Meeting is to set priorities, budget, policies, position statements, action plans, and much more, for the upcoming school year. Therefore, those members who are representing PETL at the ETFO Annual Meeting should be those who anticipate being an active member for the upcoming school year.

RATIONALE:

The date of June 1 is currently ETFO's date for submission of the ETFO Annual Meeting delegates. That date is set by ETFO. If that date were to ever be changed by ETFO, our Constitution would no longer be aligned with that date. Given that, this is meant to be a 'housekeeping' motion to simply reflect that the date is set by ETFO and that, as a local, we would abide by it and meet that due date, whatever that date may be.

PROCEDURAL MOTION:

That, notwithstanding Articles 12.5 and 12.6, the merging of the Constitution and Bylaws to be one body of work, called the Bylaws, be presented at a General Membership Meeting (GMM) of the 2024-2025 school year.

RATIONALE:

With the approval of the membership, the local would engage the services of a certified Parliamentarian to assist with the merging of our current 'Constitution and Bylaws' into a single document (called the 'PETL Bylaws') to better align with practices outlined in the current edition of *Roberts Rules of Order* which, as per our Constitution, is the official authority for conducting meetings and deliberative decision-making in our local. This complete, consolidated version of the PETL Bylaws would then be presented to the General Membership for approval at a GMM in the 2024-2025 school year.
